In 1932, the family of Wilson Brewer conveyed a nine-acre tract from the Brewer homestead to the City of Webster City in exchange for the promise to forever preserve the land its buildings, and any subsequent

The City of Webster City accepted the Brewer family proposal and has owned and maintained the Wilson Brewer Park for 85 years. The park includes: Historic Log Cabin, Original Hamilton County Courthouse, Country School House, Mulberry Center Church, Illinois Central Railroad Depot.
